




### NOTES REGARDING THE 1967 MEMBERSHIP TICKET

- 1. Annual membership tickets can carry a great deal of information about football clubs and leagues; and the above example is no exception.
- 2. The number of the membership ticket number was 191.
- 3. The phone numbers of that era will astound younger readers ... George Osborne, the Secretary, could be contacted by dialling 19; and Ed Buchanan could be reached at Dromana 45. The telephone number for the Dromana football ground was 569.
- 4. How difficult was match-day football to organize in 1967? For example, on May 20th 1967....The Senior XVIII played the Navy at Cerberus Naval Depot. Meanwhile, the Seconds travelled to Rye; and the Thirds played Morning Star in an away game. On that day players and officials were virtually 'going in all directions.'
- 5. How the club coped with medical staff/ trainers and other support staff in those days would have set quite a challenge? Often, in those days, smaller clubs had one only medical officer/ trainer; and the work load was onerous particularly if there was a serious on-field injury with which to contend.
- 6. Another aspect of such fixtures was that the club kiosk/ canteen operated every Saturday; and gave volunteers a heavy commitment for eighteen weeks each season.
- 7. For younger readers, the Morning Star team (in the Thirds competition ) which was often called the 'Boys Home' was actually a Catholic Reformatory Farm School. The farm opened in Mt Eliza in 1936; and became known as the Morning Star Youth Training Centre in later years. It closed operations in 1975. The football team was competitive and had some very talented young players. Morning Star later became known as the Sunnyside estate.
- 8. A team of historical interest in that era was the Naval Depot XVIII. The club was based at Cerberus Naval Base; and Dromana FC had a strong association with the Navy team via DFC's the former coach, Lindsay Edgerton. Lindsay was a lively personality in Southern Peninsula' football; and the Dromana and Crib Point clubs compete for the 'Edgerton Shield' whenever they meet in matches. Another very adept footballer from the Navy FC was Bernie Jeffrey who played with South Melbourne in 1956.
- 9. In 1967, DFNC was coached by former South Melbourne ruckman john Kelton . He was a highly respected footballer and a successful coach who guided the club to the finals during his time at Pier Street.
