DFNC SUMMARY & UPDATE SEASON 2022

MPNFL DIVISION: 1 SENIOR XVIII GRADE

INTRODUCTION: 'HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL' IN 2022.

All readers will recall that 2021 was a year of unresolved issues in the MPNFL as all games in the finals series were cancelled; and football, at all levels across all regions, was left in a state of limbo and widespread confusion. 2020 and 2021 will long be remembered as the 'lost years' of football and; unfortunately, there is evidence to suggest that COVID could leave its mark on community sport long after the 'coughing and sneezing' have ended. As shown in the extract below, there are real challenges to be faced and overcome...

"Rochelle Eime, professor of sport participation at Victoria University, said participation across 10 major sports in Victoria was down by approximately 15 per cent compared to pre-pandemic levels. She envisioned winter sports would fare even worse, with cold weather driving away remaining players." Source: 'The Age' July 15th 2022.

'Hope springs eternal' and every league and club across Victoria wished that 2022 would be less troubled and traumatic; and football and netball (indeed all sport) could return to some normalcy.

THE MPNFL 2022 SEASON FIXTURE

AFLSE pressed on at 'full steam' to organize the 2022 season; and, despite COVID infections severely impacting AFL clubs (e.g. West Coast Eagles), the opening round of football in the MPNFL was scheduled for April 9th.

Eighteen rounds of football were proposed; and, if all things went according to plan, the Division One finals were 'pencilled in' to commence on August 27th.

The MPNFL prudently decided that the customary MPNFL promotion/relegation system would not apply in 2022. The background to this practical and sensible judgement was explained in a statement released by AFLSE on September 15th 2021...

"It was determined that automatic promotion and relegation will not be applied this year due to the shortened home and away season and cancellation of the finals series. The application of promotion and relegation has been to promote the Division 2 team that wins the grand final, not the team which finishes first after the home and away season. As a finals series was not able to be completed, it was determined that automatic promotion should not be applied." Source: AFLSE September 2021.

Consequently, the ten teams affiliated in Division: 1 in 2022 were: Dromana, YCW, Red Hill, Pines, Edi-Asp, Frankston Bombers, Sorrento, Mt Eliza, Rosebud and Bonbeach.

THE 2022 SEASON RESULTS - SENIOR XVIII

There were no changes in the Dromana coaching panel in 2022. Matt Price, Steve Ware and Braeden Dennis were re-appointed to continue on from where they 'left off' in 2021. However, Gavin Taylor, former Dromana player, Daniel Gormley and Craig Wallace were appointed as assistant coaches for the new season at Pier Street.

The Senior leadership group for 2022 was: Billy Quigley (captain), Sam Geurts (vice-captain), Daniel Geurts (vice-captain), Billy Geurts, Terry Wheeler, Jack Slattery and Dan Marchesani.

In the lead up to the season opener, one pundit suggested that DFNC would falter in 2022; and by the season's end the club would face relegation. It was a fatuous prediction, before the bounce of ball, and was dismissed by the DFNC members as rash.



Billy Quigley was appointed captain of the Senior XVIII in 2022. Billy has all the qualities that a leader requires and the example he sets to other is unquestioned. Billy's leadership of Rosebud Cricket Club, at such a young age, was a pointer to his discipline, ability and standards. Billy brought up his 125th Senior XVIII game with the club in 2022.

OPENING CLASH AGAINST YCW

Following well-attended pre-season training sessions; and a strenuous and most competitive practice match against East Doncaster, everything seemed in order for the Tigers to spring into 2022 with quiet confidence. The club had lost a handful of talented players in Josh Bateman, Ethan Johnston and the Soligo brothers (*Nathan would return later in the season) but had recruited Broden Bird (Mornington), Tom Crimmins (Mornington) and a forward of some repute from Berwick, Jordy Andrews to the club. Jordy has represented the Casey-Cardinia FL in the AFL Worksafe Championships in 2013and 2014.

Dromana was drawn to play against YCW at the John Coburn Oval (Jubilee Park) in Round: 1 of 2022; and the team as announced, by Matt Price, for the season opener was:



It is just a lot better than the alternative." Every football club treasurer would heartily agree with Ron on that idea. Victory in Round: 1 often has tangible benefits for clubs (e.g. cash flow).

It was a most appropriate image, in the context of the year, as Terry would play his 175th match with the club and thus be entitled to be awarded Life Membership. Unfortunately, Terry missed eleven matches in 2022 following surgery to his shoulder.

As can be seen from the results below, the Tigers ticked every box against YCW and won in good style by 26 points. The convincing victory over such strong opposition was a promising start to 2022 but, with seventeen hurdles to clear, the race to the finals would not be without a few twists and turns.





Billy Quigley and Billy Geurts dominated proceedings across four quarters; and with some brilliant team work, the Tigers cemented a place in the MPNFL finals. Credit for the upset victory was given to coach Matt Price and the leadership group. In Rounds 15 &16 the tactics and team fitness were significant factors in the team's success. After Round: 16, Dromana sat on the fourth rung of the MPNFL Division: 1 Ladder with 40 points and a percentage of 115.28%

Since the half-way mark of the season (i.e. at Round: 9) Sorrento had 'hit the wall' and had lost touch with the league leaders and dropped to seventh on the table. On the other hand, Bonbeach had worked its way into second rung on the ladder. Dromana, with two drawn games, finished fourth with 44 points and a percentage of 112.74%; and consequently went on to face Frankston Bombers in the 2022 Elimination Final.

Elimination matches are 'do-or die' affairs and the game created a deal of attention in local circles. Some observers saw DFNC as the 'dark horse' in the finals race; and, as readers know, finals football usually throws up unexpected outcomes. However, as the results indicate Frankston 'came home' strongly in the final quarter; and with the Bombers' experienced players stepping up when required and better conversion, in the dying stages of a tough and low scoring affair contest, Frankston won by 19 points.

THE RESERVES IN 2022


Steve Ware and his Reserves XVIII could only be admired for the way in which they fought on against massive odds each and every week. As explained previously on this website, the Reserves team at DFNC has been the 'chopping block' for the strong Northern clubs for several years but credit to Steve and his team, for the battle they put up each week in another tough season.

In eighteen fixtures, the Reserves won just one match; and that was against Rosebud in Round: 8. the scores that day were: Dromana 5.10 (40) defeated Rosebud 4.12 (36). It was a most deserved and hard fought victory by the boys.

At the time of writing this article, since 2019 the Reserves XVIII have won just two games. (Season 2019:1 win and %=28.58%; Season 2020(No football : due to COVID-19); 2021(No wins and %=25.10%); and the details of 2022 are outlined in the next paragraph.

Although it was anticipated that the Reserves would experience challenges in MPNFL Division One, it is cannot be 'sugar-coated' that 2022 was another bruising, 'uphill slog'; and every player deserved credit for 'staying the course' Statistically, the team recorded one victory and a total of 435 'points for' while the opposing teams amassed 1398 points. The team's percentage was 31.12%

The return to the line-up of several senior players in Round: 18 (i.e. against Bonbeach) illustrated the importance of experienced players to the side. Reece Wilde, who had not played since Round: 5, kicked three goals and led by example. On that day, the Reserves kicked eight goals and recorded their highest score for the 2022 season.



Tim Stepavicius who played seventeen games in the Reserves in 2022 and featured consistently in match reviews. As at the end of the 2022 season, Tim had played 78 club games and his loyalty and service to DFNC are appreciated by his team mates and coaches. Tim is not far off breaking into senior ranks and he works hard each week in improving his skills and taking his game to the next level.



As at the end of the 2022 season, Tom had played a total of 149 club games for DFNC.

Players who were regularly cited among the team's better players in match reviews throughout the season included:

THE THIRDS IN 2022

Unfortunately, much of the fine work completed by the Third XVIII in 2022 went unnoticed because often the bounce of the ball (at 10.00am) was witnessed by a trifling number of Dromana supporters. It has always been an enigma at Pier Street as to why the Third XVIII performs before such minuscule crowds. It is hard to comprehend because the future of the club heavily depends upon this age-group of boys.



Braeden Dennis coached the Third XVIII in 2022. Not only is Braeden a former club former champion midfielder but he has been a dedicated and knowledgeable coach of the Under: 19's. One of the strengths of any football club is when former players, such as Braeden, return and take on the responsibility of developing young players. Braeden was a popular coach; and he has been a major force in building the club's playing stocks in recent years. In 2023, Ben Holmes (also a former DFNC player) will be in charge of the Thirds.

Braeden Dennis and his enthusiastic team deserve credit for another fine job in 2022 as on many occasions, boys would be called upon to take a place in the Reserve or Senior team. The Thirds were rarely at full strength but always played honestly and determinedly for the club. In a difficult season (COVID - 19 , varying local factors etc.), the Thirds played only 16 games 'Home and Away' games as there were two byes. Sorrento FC was unable to field a team in this competition which again underlined the quandary facing under-age sport.

The DFNC Thirds finished fifth on the Ladder with 44 points and a percentage of 85.70%. A handful of players including Tate Dennis, Lachlan Aquilina, Brodie Sweetnam, Joshua Smith and Riley Davis played Senior XVIII football in 2022.




An action scene from the 2022 Elimination Final at Olympic Park

THE NEXT DECADE

At this point in time, DFNC can be regarded as a contemporary and successful community sporting club which garners the support of local families and businesses. What will unfold in the next decade at Pier Street is anyone's guess? However, one thing is certain...if the club is to prosper then younger volunteers must step forward and shoulder the extensive list of duties to ensure the club is run capably and efficiently.

The crowds that attend home ground fixtures at Dromana have grown steadily over the past few years but, unfortunately, the number of volunteers that assist the club throughout the season has waned.

A recent media report in August 2022 stated...

"The 2021 census data recorded a 19 per cent drop in volunteering since the last snapshot in 2016. The depletion of the volunteer brigade is affecting sports clubs, emergency services and long-established organisations like Rotary and Lions that help run events and raise funds for local charities."

A SALUTARY TALE IN BUSH FOOTBALL

Like many community clubs, Dromana FNC has been impacted by the decline in volunteers; and the following article, which was published on the ABC website in August 2022 tells of the 'death' of the Quambatook Football Club (formed in 1910). It is a grim tale that is being repeated around Australia.
