DFNC BEST & FAIREST WINNERS UPDATE 1935-2022

Wally Guy (pictured on the left) and Jim Patterson were the first known winners of the DFNC's Best & Fairest award. The inaugural trophy was shared by Wally and Jim in 1935. It is not known how the winners of the award were decided in those early days; and it would be interesting to know if the voting system in 1935 bears any resemblance to today's method of selecting the best players each game. Billy Geurts (right) is the most recent winner of the award which is now known at the Eric Oakes Shield. Billy and Wally share a common honour in that they have won the DFNC Best & Fairest award on two occasions. Billy won in 2021 and 2022; and Wally took out the trophy in 1935 and then again in 1946.

This article is to place on permanent record the list of DFNC Best and Fairest winners in Senior, Reserves and Third Grades since 1935. Readers will concur, that it is an impressive list of names and each player has a story worth telling.



Glen Kendall won four DFNC Best & Fairest awards. He also won five Best and Fairest awards when playing with Dromana Junior FC teams...Under: 12's (1977-78), Under:14's (1979-80) and he also won the Under: 16 trophy in 1983. It was little wonder that he was drafted to St Kilda in 1989 (Pre-season draft pick 37). Glenn coached Dromana in 1994 and 95; and in all amassed 139 Senior XVIII games with DFNC (1985-2001).

THE FAMOUS NUMBER: 9 JUMPER: Dave Jordan (above left) won three DFNC Best & Fairest awards in his 164 game career. David was selected in the 'Team of the Era' (1946-2015) and captained the club for seven seasons. When David stepped down in 2002 he presented his number 9 jumper to young Michael Hunter who went on to win four Best & Fairest trophies. Two other players who won multiple DFNC Best & Fairest awards wearing number: 9 are Ray Fyson and Christian Ongarello.

THE RESERVE XVIII GRADE BEST & FAIREST RECIPIENTS

- Noel Ormesher (1995-2002-03) and Gary Ferguson (1981-83-85) have won the Reserves XVIII award on three occasions.
- Tom Auburn won the Reserves Best & Fairest in 1966 and 1967.
- Matt Chambers (2019 and 2021) and Bill Peagram (2010-11) are others who have won the trophy twice.



EARLY HISTORY OF LEAGUE AWARDS

From researching the early newspapers, the first league award for a best and fairest player was introduced sometime after 1932. The idea to publically present a trophy to the best and fairest player was first raised at the PFL's meeting at Kirkpatrick's Hotel in Mornington on October 10th 1932...

"**MEDAL FOR FAIREST PLAYER**...Mr Noble suggested that the League should present a medal for the best and fairest player in the competition, to be presented each year... Similar to the conditions of the Brownlow Medal..." Source: 'Frankston & Somerville Standard' October 22nd 1932.Page: 6

NOTE: The Brownlow Medal was introduced into VFL football in 1924.

DROMANA AND OTHER LOCAL PLAYERS TO FEATURE IN THE LEAGUE AWARDS IN THOSE EARLY DAYS INCLUDED:

- Sam McLear won the Whitlock Medal in 1934 (see above). Sam should not be confused with James (better known as Jim) McLear who played with Essendon in 1919. His brother, George, played with Richmond prior to World War: I.
- Dromana's Bert Aust came third in the Whitlock Medal in 1935 with 16 votes. Fred Volk (Red Hill) won the award that season and polled 30 votes.
- Well known and former Coburg player, Percy Berryman, of Balnarring FC, won the award in 1936. It is not known if Percy was related to Bill 'Bull' Berryman who played with South Melbourne and also represented Victoria at the Australian Championships in 1927.
- Hec Downing of Rosebud FC took out the Whitlock Medal in 1938. As a point of clarification, Wally Guy played with Sorrento in 1938 and came third in the Kirton Medal with 12 votes.
- It appears that the Whitlock Medal lapsed after World War: II; and the Best & Fairest player award in PFL 'B' Grade PFL became known as the Klein Trophy after 1945. Mr Klein was the owner the Peninsula Manufacturing Company, which was established in Mornington; and he was known to be an active member of the Carlton FC.
- The winner of the MPNL Division: 2 Best and Fairest player award receives the George Osborne Medal. The award is named in honour of DFNC's eminent football administrator George Osborne.



Bob Moorehead won the club's Best & Fairest on two occasions in 1953 and 1954. On both occasions he tied in the count with a team mate. In 1953 it was with Jack Duncan; and the following season he shared the award with the club's 1st XVIII Coach Ken Brown. Bob played 251 senior games with Dromana FC; and was a member of the 1950 premiership team. Bob played in the 1948 MPFL Inter-league team and was chosen in the DFNC Team of the Era (1946-2015) in the forward pocket. Bob also coached the Reserves in 1954.
