

THE DFNC GOAL KICKING FACTS & FIGURES

This DFNC History Page article lists the top ten goal kickers for the Senior XVIII Grade for the seasons 2013-22. The entries below have been updated until the end of the 2022 season. The average goals, per game for each player, are also shown in the right hand column. By scrolling down the article, readers can also see the club's goal kicking award winners from 1908.



Jordy Andrews won the club goal kicking award in 2022 with 35 goals at an average of 1.84 goals per game. Jordy finished fourth on the MPNFL table; and during the season he had three hauls of four goals. Jordy, who was recruited to DFNC from Berwick, played 19 senior XVIII games and was a key forward throughout 2022.

In 2021, Ethan Johnstone won the club's goal kicking award for the third time in his Senior XVIII career at DFNC. In 2021, Ethan booted 28 goals in 11 games (a truncated COVID-19 season) at an average of 2.55 goals per game. In 2022, Ethan was cleared to Noosa FC (QFL) but returned to DFNC in 2023.

Anthony Bruhn booted 67 goals at an average of 3.2 goals per game in 2014. Anthony played 55 games for DFNC and booted 167 goals. In 2017, Anthony played a major role in YCW's premiership win over Bonbeach by kicking four goals. Anthony also played 10 games with Footscray Bulldogs in the VFL in 2017-18.

UPDATE OF DFNC LISTS FROM 1900-2021

In addition to the above lists, the Senior XVIII Grade goal kicking lists from 1900-2021 have been revisited and up-dated (see below). While headway has been made in this history project, unfortunately, the winners of the award, from seasons 1900-1907, are still unknown; and the names of the winners in 1975 and 76 are proving difficult to confirm.

The data, regarding Reserves and Third XVIII goal kicking winners in earlier years is unknown and it is difficult to unearth the winners in the period 1970 - 2000.

Former forward and utility and dual premiership player, Beau Cosson, won the club goal kicking award in 2016 with 32 goals (average 1.94 goals per game).

NOTES REGARDING CLUB GOAL KICKING AWARDS

- 1. In the first decade of the club's existence, there appears to be no records related to club goal kicking. It could have been that the early matches were 'ad hoc' or perhaps the results were misplaced or deemed 'not necessary'.
- 2. The small season tallies in the early years may simply reflect the number of games played in the local fixtures. The first DFNC player to kick 20 goals in a season was Wally Guy (in 1930 with 45 goals). The first player to better 50 goals in a season was also Wally. He kicked 75 goals in 1931. That figure would stand as the club record until 1957.
- 3. W. 'Bill' Patterson won the goal kicking for Dromana on six occasions (1923-29-32-33-34-35); and he was regarded as a star of his era. Bill's best return was 66 goals in 1935.
- 4. Despite investigation, no connection could be made between Dromana's William Patterson and William 'Banjo' Patterson (born at Noorat in 1888) who played with St Kilda in earlier times and coached the Saints, in one game, in 1938.
- 5. In a match against Pearcedale in June 1932, Bill Patterson kicked eight goals in the team's total of sixteen.
- 6. Players who have kicked more than 50 goals in one season for Dromana include:-

W Guy (1931), W. Patterson (1935), K. Taylor (1950), H. Fletcher (1953), L. Coyne (1957), J. Nix (1964), G. James (1971-72), N. Watson (1982), T. Woodford (1984), F. Cook (1988), S. Tobin (1991-92), D. Labozzetta (1999), H. Laube (2002-03), Tim Allen (2003), S. Goosey (2006-07-08), A. Bruhn (2013-14) and Ethan Johnstone (2017-18).

There may be others and the compilation of goal kickers, in all grades, is an on-going project. Sam Fowler booted 49 goals at an average of 2.23 goals per game in 2019.

- 7. The record for the most goals kicked in any season, by a Dromana footballer, is held by Simon Goosey (105 goals in 2006). In his three seasons at DFNC, Simon kicked 256 goals at an imposing average of 5.22 goals per game. A story about Simon Goosey can be found on this website. - 8. In 1997, Tim Coyle won the goal kicking with just five goals. An article, regarding the 1997 season, can be found on this website and it will explain much about Tim's total in that season. (Reference: 2017/10)
- 9. Tracking down the 1962 winner took an 'eternity' but it was recently confirmed that Don Jordan won the award with 76 goals.

John Nix kicked 65 goals for Dromana in 1964. It is interesting that John was not known for his goal kicking exploits at Richmond; and in his 95 games, with Richmond, he kicked a total of only 18 goals. However, in his first game for Dromana, against the Army in 1964, John booted nine goals.

Steven Tobin was one of the all-time great forwards at Pier Street. Steve was cleared to Sorrento FC in 1993; and, in later years, played with Doveton Eagles, Brim, Tooradin, Cranbourne, Morwell and Boolarra. It is documented that Steve played approximately 330 games and amassed 1235 goals.

FOOTNOTES: SIMON GOOSEY AND HIS 'TON' AT PIER STREET



Simon Goosey is the only player in Dromana's long history to kick 100 goals in a season. He played at Pier Street from 2006 until 2008; and he booted 256 goals at an average of 5.22 goals per game. Although records are made to broken, Simon's goal kicking performance may never be repeated in local football. Perhaps a DFNC youngster with a true boot, like Simon, will hopefully emerge in the future.... Fingers crossed and time will tell!


- 1. Simon Goosey was one of the 'biggest names' in country football; and the town was abuzz when he arrived for pre-season training at Dromana in 2006. Not onlyhad the club secured a proven goal kicker but also Simon was a genuineVCFL star who held celebrity status in country/suburban football circles.
- 2. Simon had an unparalleled career in VCFL football and is still referred to as the 'champion from Mornington.' Ken Peisse, a noted sports historian, once labelled Simon Goosey as the 'Coleman of the Bush.'
- 3. Simon first came under notice in 1987 when he kicked 84 goals and won the VFL Under: 19 competition goal-kicking award with Richmond Third XVIII. However, bad luck struck in 1988 when he broke his leg; and, it is fair to suggest, that such a severe injury hampered his pathway into AFL senior ranks.



Once described as the 'Coleman of the Bush-Simon Goosey.

- 4. At the age of 21, Simon Goosey crossed to Geelong FC and, despite some excellent performances in the Geelong Reserves; he was never selected to play a senior match of AFL football.
- 5. Between 1988 and 2005, Simon returned to Mornington and played more than 250 games with the Bulldogs. He enjoyed a successful stint in VFA football with the Frankston Dolphins where he gave some impressive performances in defence.
- 6. Analysis of Simon's goal kicking at Mornington reveals that his record, in front of goal, was nothing short of amazing. In 253 games, with the Bulldogs, he booted 1605 goals at average of 6.34 goals per game.
- 7. When Simon arrived at Dromana, his ability to draw crowds and create interest in the club was imposing. At each home game, young fans would gather behind 'his' goal square and watch the 'master go about his work.'
- 8. In three years at Dromana, Simon kicked 256 goals at an average of 5.22 goals per game. (Note: Simon was 38 years of age when he made his debut for Dromana in 2006)

- 9. In his first season at DFC, Simon kicked a bag of five goals on 10 occasions including: 14 goals against Frankston, 13 goals against Crib Point, 12 goals against Rosebud and 11 goals against Somerville and Pearcedale.
- 10. In 2006 he kicked 'the ton' (107) goals, then followed up with 69 goals in 2007. His 80 goals in 2008 included 11 goals against Pearcedale and he netted ten against Crib Point.
- 10. Simon set a benchmark for others in conversion; and he worked hard in perfecting his 'craft' during practice sessions. In those days at training at Dromana, younger players (e.g. Michael Hunter, George Papalas, Jared Terry, Sam and Toby Banks) tried hard to emulate Simon's ability to 'thread the needle.' It is safe to say, no one could better Simon in the 'art' of goal kicking.
- 11. Simon Goosey made a lasting impression at Dromana. When the DFC selected its Team of the Era (1945-2015), he was named as the full forward. In 2009, he returned to Mornington FC and began his career as a skills coach, at AFL level, with Hawthorn and Footscray. He later became an assistant coach to Gary Ayres at VFA club, Port Melbourne.



Simon stepped down as the coach of Mornington in 2022. It was big news in local football as it was a closing chapter on an amazing career that had spanned three decades.

- 13. Following his career at Mornington FC, Simon was appointed as the coach of Frankston (VFA). In his five years as Senior XVIII coach, he achieved much in lifting the Dolphins from the bottom of the VFL Ladder; and his skill in developing young players was widely acknowledged. Several of the players, who Simon coached at Frankston Dolphins, went onto to carve out rewarding careers at AFL level.
- 14. Interspersed with his years as a player were representative games with the VCFL, the MPNFL and the NFL. Simon was also selected to play in Channel: 9 annual celebrity-charity matches known as the 'Teddy Whitten Legends Game.' 15. Simon also coached at Cranbourne FC for three seasons and took CFC to a premiership in 2016. It is known that he played in a mid-week Reclink FL match at full forward at the age of 'about 48'.

- 16. Following his stint at Cranbourne as coach, Simon returned to Mornington for the 2018 season.
- 17. In 2018 Simon made a brief comeback, at the age of 50 years, to assist the Mornington Reserves field a team in a match against Rosebud at Alexandra Park. Simon played three quarters in that game and kicked two goals which helped his team to victory.

CAN YOU HELP WITH THIS DFNC HISTORY PROJECT?

The details of goal kicking awards in 1975 and 1976 are yet to be confirmed but several unsubstantiated suggestions to the 'mysteries' have been offered and will be followed up in the course of this year.

It is hoped that Reserves and Thirds goal-kickers, from earlier seasons, can also be filed in the archives; and any information, from readers, regarding past goal-kicking statistics in lower grades would be valued.
