

The boys had a solid pre-season, we were training a lot with the senior group which really helped them to step up and push themselves to keep up with older guys. It was great to see about 10 of the 2021 Under 17's progress to playing Under 19's. After a few months of training through a warm summer and the 2021 season cut short we were itching to play a game. We had two good practice matches where we could put our game plan into practice and get a feel of how the team would get together.

Going into Round 1 against Frankston YCW was always going to be a tough game first up as they had a 100+ point win from their first game the previous week. Preparation wasn't ideal as Braeden & 2 of the boys got Covid so they were missing for match day. We went into the game with only 18 players but each of them was truly focused and ready to start the season with a win. The first 3 quarters were great, from the first bounce the pressure & intensity was faultless. YCW got a late goal on the siren at the end of the 3rd qtr which put

them up by 5 points and we were down to 16 players. We battled hard in the last quarter and put up a gallant fight but playing 2 down was making it hard to hold on, eventually going down by 27 pts.

#### THE RESERVES BY COACH STEVE WARE

If EFFORT, ENDEAVOUR and INTENSITY were three words that the reserves side aimed to bring every week in 2021 then 2022 is no different and we need to step it up a notch to COMPETE. Pre-season saw a renewed focus on the style of play we think will best suit us in 2022.

Through a number of match simulations, an intraclub and practice matches against Altona and East Doncaster it was great to see elements of this style of play being implemented and players buying-in. The proposition of more depth and player numbers has also shone through and is hopefully maintained throughout the season.

Onto the season proper and with no easy round 1 and 2 propositions against 2 quality reserves sides in Frankston YCW and Red Hill away from home we knew we would need to be up to challenge from the start. The round 1 effort against YCW was in stark contrast to last year's contest. The boys brought the heat early and although YCW got off to a quick start by kicking 4 goals to 0 in the first quarter our pressure around the ground was high. The second quarter was a tight tussle with YCW kicking 3 goals to our 1. In the third quarter, the boys maintained the pressure and restricted YCW to 2 goals. YCW asserted their dominance in the final quarter by kicking 6 goals and blowing the margin out to 93 points. This wasn't a true reflection of our efforts for the previous 3 quarters but also showed how far we have come and need to go to COMPETE against quality opposition. After promising signs against YCW in Round 1, the boys were pointing towards a good showing in the Good Friday Round 2 match against Red Hill. Unfortunately, they weren't up for the challenge early and Red Hill kicked 6 goals to 0 in the first quarter. The boys took it up to Red Hill in the second term and restricted them to 2 goals as the work rate increased around the ground. In the third term, Red Hill kicked 4 goals to our 1 but again the effort and work rate improved. At the three-quarter time break, the boys were encouraged to run out the game which they were unable to do the previous week. To the boys credit they controlled multiple passages of play and were afforded multiple scoring opportunities with entries into our forward half but weren't able to convert them into goals. #### PLAYER HISTORY UPDATE - 100 CLUB GAMES OR MORE FOR DROMANA FNC.

The table below is the first of a series that will be published in 'Tiger Talk' during 2022 regarding the playing history of our current\*\* players (and those who played at least one game with DFNC in 2021). 'Club Games' simply means the total of games played in Thirds, Reserves and Seniors teams at Dromana Football Club. \*\* **Note:** These records are calculated up until the end of the **2021 season.**

#### **GREAT TIGER VICTORIES - v SEAFORD 1930 by Roger Spaull**

Each edition of the 'Tiger Talk' in 2022 will carry a brief account of a match from the club's earlier years. It is hoped that the articles will rekindle memories and allow current members to appreciate the endeavours of those who went before and strived to maintain and strengthen the club. This match review is in regard to a match which took place more than 90 years ago at Seaford.

In 1930, the Peninsula District Football Association comprised the following nine teams...Dromana, Flinders, Frankston, Langwarrin, Mornington, Red Hill, Rosebud, Seaford and Tyabb. While it is recorded that Henry McLear was the captain in 1929, it is known that in 1930 Michael Nolan was appointed as the coach of Dromana FC. Other family names listed in match reports during 1930 were: - Gleeson, Hewson, Farrel, Wilson, Skillen, Patterson, Singleton, Guy, Clydesdale, Griffiths, Rudduck, Mirabella, Gray, Evans, Birch and Langholtz. **Note:** Bert Aust was playing with Mornington that season but returned to DFC in 1931.

The club had made an impressive start to the season with three victories from four outings; and the team travelled to Seaford for the Round: 5 match. The Dromana FC scribe known as the 'Spectator' provided few details about the game itself; and his main comments focused on the poor standard of umpiring that day. His negative remarks about the umpire were scathing and would have caused a deal of sharp comment 'around the traps.'

'Spectator' didn't waste words in his match report and in his brief description of the game, simply wrote that Dromana won by eight goals. There were no final scores or goal kickers provided but the best players were listed as: - W. Grey (perhaps meant to read Guy) Murphy, Nolan, Clydesdale, F. Gray, W. Evans G. Ruddick, R. Birch and W. Patterson.

With that victory, Dromana sat on the second rung of the ladder with four wins. Frankston held top position while Flinders was winless at that point of the season. In Round 6, Dromana was listed to meet Mornington in an all-important clash in the race to the finals.

Things at Dromana FC must have been running like 'clockwork' in 1930 as it was stated in the 'Frankston-Somerville Standard' (June 7<sup>th</sup> 1930) that... "A *big number of people followed the team to Seaford on Saturday. At the present time football is booming at Dromana."* 

It was indeed an accurate statement because the club went on to play finals that season and in 1931 Dromana defeated Somerville by 61 points to 'break the ice' and win its first-ever pennant.
