



## PLAYER PROFILE - JAKE AARTS by Roger Spaul

The news that Jake Aarts had been cleared to play with Dromana FNC captured the interest of football followers far and wide; and the story hit the sporting headlines in the metropolitan and local media. As can be imagined, such a signing sent a ripple of excitement through the township; and the Tigers supporters greeted Jake's decision, to cross to Pier Street, with unbridled enthusiasm. The fact that the Tigers had gained such an accomplished AFL footballer underlined the fact that DFNC had become a 'destination club' in community football.

Jake Aarts (born 1994) first came under notice in school football where he was standout for St Xavier's College Beaconsfield. He 'caught the eye' of knowledgeable observers with his skills, courage in heavy traffic and ability to create opportunities for his teammates. There was much to like about Jake's brand of football; and following his outstanding performances for Beaconsfield (Casey-Cardinia FL) he was signed by the VFL club Bendigo in 2013. Bendigo (which is no longer affiliated with the VFL) was a fertile breeding ground for many current / recent AFL footballers such as Austin Jones (also from Beaconsfield), Jake Carlisle, Stewart Crameri, Jake Stringer, Bachar Houli, Michael Hibberd and Jake Melksham.

VFL football presented Jake with the chance to 'hone his skills' and he played 33 games with Bendigo mainly as a midfielder. He kicked ten goals; and his impressive performances also signalled that he was ready for the next level. Consequently, in 2015 Jake was listed with Richmond Reserves. It was an extensive apprenticeship but Jake played with spirit and flair (and a degree of patience); and received the honour of being a member of the VFL team's leadership group.

In all, Jake played 79 VFL /Reserves Grade football games with Richmond and booted 76 goals. During his time with the Tigers' VFL team his coaches included: Tim Clarke (98 games with Hawthorn (2000-2008) and Craig McRae who is currently making such a strong impression in leading Collingwood FC. to new heights. Jake's dedication and perseverance paid off; and in 2019, he was chosen by Richmond FC at number 15 in the AFL Rookie Draft. It was a most warranted reward for his resolve on the track and gritty endeavours at VFL level.

It had been a long journey from Beaconsfield to AFL ranks for Jake. He was 25 years and 210 days when he made his debut for the Tigers in Round: 5 2020 at the MCG for the clash against Melbourne. On that memorable day in his career, Jake played alongside Dustin Martin, Jack Riewoldt, Tom Lunch, Trent Cochin, Dion Prestia, Shane Edwards and an emerging young player named Liam Baker (ex-Subiaco WAFL) who would, within a short space of time, become a highly rated utility player at Punt Road.

**Note:** 1 In season 2020, Jake was given jumper number 39 which had been previously worn by Nathan Drummond (ex-Mooroopna-GVFL). It is not widely known that Nathan's great-grandfather, Thomas Taylor Drummond, was a former champion of Collingwood (1916-1922).

**Note: 2** Round: 5 in 2020 was a most unusual start to Jake's AFL career as there were no spectators permitted in the stands at the MCG that day (i.e. because of COVID -19 lockdown protocols).

Jake played 14 Senior XVIII games in 2020, 21 games in 2021 and seven last year for a total of 42 games and 34 goals. Using the available statistics, arguably, Jake's finest outing for Richmond was against Fremantle in Round 15, 2020 when he received one Brownlow Medal vote for his display as a running forward. Jake also created a lot of comment for his dashing exhibition against Essendon in the Dreamtime clash at the Perth Stadium (i.e. COVID-19 venue) in June 2021.

For those who enjoy football statistics, Jake's figures make interesting study; and highlight his willingness to share the ball and provide chances for his teammates. In short, Jake was a creative and unselfish player for Richmond FC.

# The History Page - by Roger Spaull



#### FAMOUS FOOTBALL FAMILIES - THE RUSH FAMILY - By Roger Spaull

#### The famous footballer and administrator Bob Rush (1880-1975).

The Rush family name has some meaning to Dromana Football Club because in 2003 John Rush played five Senior XVIII games (and numerous Reserves XVIII matches) with the club. John was an amiable and popular player who travelled from the city each week to don the 'Hoppers' guernsey. John's family is a remarkable story in the history of Australian football. The most famous member of the Rush family is Robert 'Bob' Rush who was born in Richmond in 1880; and was recruited from Parade College to Collingwood in 1889. Bob went on to play 142 games (one goal only) with the

Magpies. He was a member of the Collingwood premiership teams in 1902-03; and was awarded Life Membership in 1909. Bob was inducted into the CFC Hall of Fame in 2008.


While Bob was a reliable and stout-hearted defender, his contribution to Collingwood as an administrator was unparalleled; and a major factor in the success of the Magpies during the Jock McHale dynasty.

"Only three men had stands named after them at Victoria Park.

Only a handful has official club trophies that bear their names.

And only one man has **both** – Bob Rush. Those dual honours speak

volumes for the contribution Bob Rush made to the Collingwood Football Club
in a remarkable career that stretched more than 50 years." Source: 'Collingwood Forever' website.



- Bryan Rush played with Collingwood (1913-14); and although he only played 17 senior games with Collingwood he was selected to represent NSW in 1924.
- Gerald Rush played 15 games for Richmond in 1920.
- Kevin (Richmond 7 games in 1923-24).
- William (aka 'Leo') played for Melbourne (1911-12).

#### **GREAT TIGER VICTORIES - 1998 V SORRENTO By Roger Spaull**

This important victory was achieved over Sorrento on April 18<sup>th</sup> 1998. In those years, Sorrento and Dromana had hit 'rough patches' in their respective histories; and both clubs were 'fighting like fury' to survive, remain competitive and climb the Nepean FL Ladder. Younger readers may find it hard to believe that both Dromana and Sorrento were 'cellar dwellers' in those days of local football.

The clash, between the traditional rivals created keen interest and, of course, the usual friendly banter. The Pier Street Oval looked 'a picture' and the fine weather aided a sizeable attendance. Injuries and late withdrawals from the DFC line-up impacted heavily; and the team went into the game without David Labbozetta, Glenn Kendall, Steve Kerr, Dustin Douglas and Andrew Rowler. Young Aaron Jarman was a last minute inclusion that day. Such a major reshuffle and the loss of key men must have been frustrating for Steve Scagliarini who was DFC's Senior XVIII Coach that season.

The game was played with spirit and vigour as both sides jostled for supremacy. The team captain, David Jordan, gave a sparkling display in the centre; and the former Melbourne and St Kilda forward Jeff Hilton created numerous chances with his creative play and accurate disposal. The first half was an 'arm-wrestle'; and it wasn't until Damon Quigley (Billy's Dad and ex-Melton utility) and Craig Compton 'broke the shackles' and 'nailed' a combined tally of seven goals that the game swung in Dromana's favour. Young Casey Landrigan kicked an important goal and Dan Nicolle (former Under: 18 captain) booted two majors in an impressive performance. Casey together with Dave Jordan and Brendan Trigg provided constant drive from the midfield.

Dromana held the 'whip hand' in the last term; and as the clock ticked down the forwards enjoyed the space and the lack of defensive pressure by the Sorrento defence and ran out convincing winners by 48 points.

### Final scores: Dromana 14.13 (97) defeated Sorrento 7.7(49)

Goal kickers for Dromana: Compton 4 Quigley 3 Nicolle 2 Jordan 2 Oates Landrigan Hazeldine Best players for Dromana: Jordan Hilton Veale Trigg Morrice and Leah.

The above triumph was Dromana's only win that season. There will be some readers who will remember those perplexing years at Pier Street when the players worked hard against formidable odds without tangible rewards. However, on that day, the Dromana faithful was well pleased with the efforts of all the players especially the emerging youngsters such as Dan Nicolle, Casey Landrigan, Aaron Jarman, Troy Parker and a very brave ruckman named Robbie Thoday.

Note: In 1998, Andrew Rowler took out the Senior XVIII Best and Fairest award and Dan Nicolle won the goal kicking trophy.
